J. H. Koch.

JOHN HENRY KOCH was born in Wellmar, Electorate of Hessen, Germany, February 14, 1807. Educated in the Lutheran Church, he immigrated in 1834 to this country, where, on arriving at Baltimore, Md., he became acquainted with the United Brethren Church. Going from Baltimore to New Orleans, La., he was there attacked with yellow fever, and resolved on his sick-bed to serve God with his whole heart. Returning to the north he found employment in Cincinnati, where Brother Nuelson invited him to attend the meetings of German Methodists, and here, under the preaching of Father Schmucker and Dr. William Nast, God awak-

ened and converted his soul. In 1840 he married his surviving faithful companion, and about a year after he felt the call to preach the Gospel; and as the Church also was convinced that he ought to work as a missionary among his countrymen he received a license to preach, and in 1845 the Kentucky Conference received him on probation. From this time he was appointed to the following charges: West Union, Pomeroy, Captina, in Ohio; Wheeling, W. Va.; Portsmouth, Madison, New Albany, Mount Vernon, Ind.; Louisville, Ky.; Madison-street, Lawrenceburgh, Batesville, Poland and Greencastle, La Fayette, and Bradford. His health failing, he retired from the effective service, taking a superannuated relation for three years, after which he re-entered the active work and served two years at Madison and one year at Charlestown, Ind., where he died October 1, 1871, in his sixty-fifth year.

His disease, contracted by the hardships of the itinerancy, was very painful, but he suffered very patiently. His faith was strong, his trust in God constant, and his hope full of life and assurance. At a late visit by his Presiding Elder he declared that whether life or death his trust was immovable in God. Often in the most painful hours he sang the songs of Zion, and even near death joined in the beautiful German hymn, "Father in heaven, hear our prayer," etc. Brother Koch was a loving husband and father, a true friend, an earnest Christian, and a faithful itinerant. Many were converted under his ministry, and great is his reward in heaven.
