Detroit Conference Commission on Archives and History Records, 1934-2011

History Note:

The Detroit Conference Historical Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church was founded in 1880 and continued until the merger of the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church in 1968. The merged historical group became known as the Committee (later Commission) on Archives and History. The Commission manages the historical work of the Detroit Conference, including the operation of the Conference archives.

Scope Note:

The collection contains commission minutes, reports, subject files, historical papers delivered at meetings, information about North Central Jurisdiction Commission on Archives and History meetings, and reference correspondence.

Extent:

6.0 linear feet (ca. 12,000 pages)

Access Restrictions:

The collection is open to research.
