### Charles I. Bragg Personal Papers, 1855-1920

#### **Biographical Note:**

Charles Bragg was born 21 February 1877 in Dundee, Michigan. He was a Methodist Protestant minister, served as President of the Michigan Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church, and (after the 1939 merger) became a minister in the combined Methodist Church. His first appointment was at Attica in 1906. He also served at Goodland, Yale, Rea, Cone, Lansing Main Street Methodist Church, Columbiaville, Clio, Marlette, London, and Mooreville. He was one of the commissioners of Methodist Union, helping to plan the 1939 merger. He retired completely in 1946. Charles Bragg died 18 February 1967, as Detroit Conference Cane holder (presented to the oldest living member of the conference).

#### **Scope Note:**

The collection contains a typewritten autobiography, drafts of Rev. Bragg's writings on the history of the Michigan Conference of Methodist Protestant Church, a pastor's record book (1909-1912), some sermons, and material he retained from his work on the 1939 Methodist Union.
